**Over the coming year I will be including in the newsletter small chunks of information for the newer archers. Things that are important but may not be said often enough.**

**So here goes with chunk 3:**

#### **Drawing arrows from the boss.**

If you are drawing arrows from the target be careful of them & do not bend them. Grip the arrow, with some form of puller, as close to the boss as possible (alyls/wooden). Carbon arrows should never be pulled with bare hands (carbon fibres are virtually invisible on an arrow). Grip carbon arrows about 2"/50mm from the boss, a straight pull ensures the arrow is not broken or bent. If you break an arrow by any method other than hitting it with your arrow, you are expected to offer payment to replace it then & there.

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If you have a **miss**, *do not go looking for it until you have scored your hits*. If you find other arrows in your search for yours, then remove the arrow from the ground & stick in the ground vertically. Unless you are asked to retrieve arrows leave them vertical in the ground. It is helpful to know if your arrows are high, low, left or right of the boss.

## Calling all Junior Archers

We've decided to give you all something to aim for by forming a junior league. To qualify for the league, you need to be under 18 at the 1<sup>st</sup> April, and be a Junior Member of Allington Castle Archers. The format is very relaxed, but there are one or two rules, which are printed later. To summarise them:

- You can submit the score for any GNAS recognised round shot between 1<sup>st</sup> May and 31<sup>st</sup> October. This means you need to shoot a minimum of 4 dozen arrows over at least 2 distances.
- The rounds do not have to be shot at any formal event, club practice days are fine. You do not all have to shoot on the same day
- The league will be based on handicap adjusted scores for each round shot. If you don't have a handicap, don't worry. The handicap for the round shot will be calculated from the score submitted
- Score sheets must be complete and legible
- You can submit as many scores as you like. Only your best 5 handicap adjusted scores will count towards your league position
- The winner will receive a trophy (to be held for 1 year) and a medal
- The runner up will receive a medal.

As juniors you represent the future of archery. Let's show how good you are. Happy shooting!

## ACA Junior League Rules

- 1 The league is open to any junior archer (under 18 years of age at the start of the outdoor season) who is a member of the ACA.
- 2 Any GNAS recognised outdoor round score can be submitted for inclusion in the league. Rounds must be shot between 1<sup>st</sup> May and 31<sup>st</sup> October in any season. Rounds may be shot at club practise days, open tournaments, club tournaments, mid-Kent league, etc. i.e. any GNAS round shot between 1<sup>st</sup> May and 31<sup>st</sup> October may be submitted for inclusion in the league.
- 3 Scores must be submitted to the club vice captain, to arrive no later than 7<sup>th</sup> November. Scores may be handed to the vice captain on the field, left in the folder provided in the club storeroom, sent by post, or sent by email ([Gareth@kentkiteflyers.org.uk](mailto:Gareth@kentkiteflyers.org.uk)). If submitting by email, please include "ACA Junior League" in the subject. Scores not including this may be automatically deleted by spam filters.
- 4 Score sheets must include the following  
Name of Archer

- Age of Archer  
Date of Round  
Round shot  
Place shot
- 5 A complete score sheet must be submitted, i.e. including for each dozen arrows:  
Score  
Hits  
Golds  
and the total of each of the above for the round. It is not necessary to include individual arrow scores, though this would be helpful.
  - 6 Scoresheets must be legible! Illegible score sheets will be ignored!
  - 7 For each round shot the handicap for that round will be calculated and the handicap adjusted score used to determine league position.
  - 8 Archers may submit as many scores as they wish. However, they must submit at least 5 (five) scores to be included in the final rankings. For any archer submitting more scores, only their best 5 (five) scores will be used to calculate their league ranking.
  - 9 League rankings will be based on the sum of the handicap adjusted score for the archers 5 (five) best rounds. In the event of a tie, the prize will be shared.
  - 10 A trophy will be presented to the league winner, to be retained for 1 year. [note trophy to be provided by GW] Medals will be provided for the winner and runner up [note club to provide medals].
  - 11 League rankings will be posted in the club store as at the end of each calendar month. League rankings will also be published in the club newsletter.


### New members

### **Coaching Tips**



#### Check your bracing height

About 21 cm to 23cm  
Change by adding or reducing the number of twists in the string

#### Check your nocking point

4 / 5 mm above right angle  
from rest to string
